news story it emphasizes the fundamentals as well as the emerging issues such as technology and ethics in journalistic writing after using this motivational and engaging text your students will be well prepared to write effectively in every news medium

using examples and exercises the process of writing news takes an impact elements and words approach to demystify reporting and writing for beginners this is a concise book that approaches writing as a process using a pedagogy that has proven effective in each chapter the book addresses the roles of journalists at several levels of abstraction beginning with their responsibilities to audiences in a democratic society and continuing with ethical decision making in fulfilling those responsibilities each chapter ends with reporting and writing exercises which allow the reader to develop skills for informing audiences and telling compelling stories in print broadcast and online news media and to practice and be evaluated on those skills the reader is taken through a year in the life of a fictional community revisiting issues and stories in a series of more than two dozen linked exercises of increasing complexity from lede writing to handling a major breaking story on deadline there are even opportunities to report and write from the reader s own community

news writing and reporting for today's media teaches the basics of journalism for print and broadcast by focusing on real reporters in real situations the fourth edition features new sections on the technological changes affecting reporting in the 90's updated examples of news writing that reflect major stories and a revised part 1 that gets students to write earlier in the semester

an eviscerating look at the state of journalism in the age of the 24 hour news cycle by a pulitzer prize winning television critic and a veteran news correspondent no time to think focuses on the insidious and increasing portion of the news media that due to the dangerously extreme speed at which it is produced is only half thought out half true and lazily repeated from anonymous sources interested in selling opinion and wild speculation as news these news item can easily gain exposure today assuming a life of their own while making a mockery of journalism and creating casualties of cool deliberation and thoughtful discourse much of it is picked up gratuitously and given resonance online or through cnn fox news msnbc and other networks which must in this age of the 24 hour news cycle feed the beast in dissecting this frantic news blur no time to think breaks down a number of speed driven blunders from the insider perspective of charles feldman who spent 20 years as a cnn correspondent as well as the outsider perspective of howard rosenberg who covered the coverage for 25 years as tv critic for the los angeles times no time to think demonstrates how today's media blitz scrambles the public's perspective in ways that potentially shape how we think act and react as a global society the end result effects not only the media and the public but also the government leaders we trust to make carefully considered decisions on our behalf featuring interviews ranging from former nbc news anchor tom brokaw to internet doyenne arianna huffington to pbs stalwart jim lehrer to cnn chief jonathan klein to a host of former presidential press secretaries and other keen eyed media watchers this incisive work measures lasting fallout from the 24 hour news cycle beginning in 1980 with the arrival of cnn right up to the present

freedom of the press is a primary american value good journalism builds communities arms citizens with important information and serves as a public watchdog for civic national and global issues but what happens when the news turns

its back on its public role leonard downie jr executive editor of the washington post and robert g kaiser associate editor and senior correspondent report on a growing crisis in american journalism from the corporatization that leads media moguls to slash content for profit to newsrooms that ignore global crises to report on personal entertainment these veteran journalists chronicle an erosion of independent relevant journalism in the process they make clear why incorruptible reporting is crucial to american society rooted in interviews and first hand accounts the authors take us inside the politically charged world of one of america s powerful institutions the media

written by veteran journalist and noted professor jim willis with an epilogue by marilyn thomsen this book introduces journalistic decision making into the classroom alongside discussion of reporting and writing techniques students peer inside the minds of a cross section of print broadcast and online journalists by way of exclusive interviews and additional research that provide a deep broad glimpse into how they perceive themselves their world and their craft ultimately this provocative text provides added insights into how journalists think and why they do what they do features and benefits original interviews with contemporary journalists at varying career stages offers a rarely seen inside look at the world of journalists from media outlets such as the los angeles times the boston globe cnn the memphis commercial appeal kusa television in denver and the oklahoman anecdotes involving how journalists work translates abstract thinking into the reality of everyday journalism interviews with several war reporters portrays the impact of covering war on those reporting from the field an example of how different journalists approach traumatic stories such as 9 11 the oklahoma city bombing and hurricane katrina illuminates different orientations to conveying truth and dealing with ethical dilemmas involved in such disaster coverage seasoned journalists examine the following areas factors that lure young people into journalism as a career the stance journalists take toward the world they are assigned to cover ethical dilemmas how close to get to a story or how far to distance themselves from it the socialization of journalists and the role their own personal ideologies may play in their work as reporters and editors how one s faith might influence the coverage of a story the mixing of news and entertainment the mind of a journalist is an appropriate and innovative supplement for a variety of media studies courses including introduction to journalism news writing and reporting advanced reporting journalism and society and ethics among many others

this title argues that not only do us news media have a duty to cover international events that affect the interests of the public and the government they should also bring more attention to international conflict and suffering

with coverage of every aspect of broadcast journalism including writing reporting and production this book provides the tools to succeed clear and well organized discussions and explanations suggestions from professional journalists and actual real world examples

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
